In the US the 7900xt is currently \$800ish and you can find a 7900xtx for about \$1050.. So there's like a \$250 difference between the cards at the moment... The XT is a cut down version of the XTX with 315W vs 355W and 1/6 compute dies and associated memory removed. You lose 1/6th of the power and 4Go of VRAM.

Unless you need 24Go and the max power that the XTX can give, there is no cause to buy it. I guess the XTX could do juuuuust the amount of power you need and the XT would be below your threshold, but apart from that, no, there isn't any real reason currently.

The \$800 XTs are MBA and the AIB models are at least \$850. You can get an AIB 7900XTX for \$999 like the Asrock Phantom OCed or the Powercolor Hellhound. So it is \$150 difference between AIB models

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Choose whichever you feel is the better value, honestly. I have the MBA (Reference) Sapphire 7900 XTX and it's a freaking beast.
