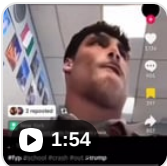

There have 12 people, being a highly trained genius, to pull it in perspective, a person with an IQ of 100 is not a genius. The average person's IQ is 100. If we consider a person significantly more or less intelligent than another person when there is a difference of 15 points (one standard deviation).
