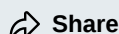
I had to add my files into the repo via upload, but then none of my commit messages appear. This method is also a lot slower...

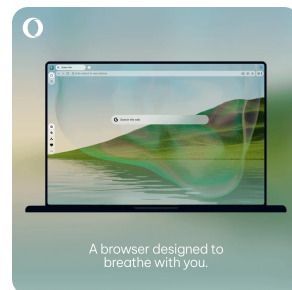

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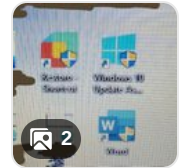
