

From my understanding, when you rip a cd the software compares it to their database to make sure its a perfect copy. If not, it lets you know. It also records what kind of CD Drive you were using. It could be a scratched cd, or it could be your cd drive is a little worse than others. There may be a little bias (expensive drives may only be used to read brand new cds, cheap drives might be used to read more thrift store finds) but multiplied by tens of thousands of sessions, it's probably the most objective data you need on the subject.

I got an external Samsung that was high on the list. It was pretty inexpensive.

I have 3 that all work pretty well. An old Sony that is the fastest and has the best error correction; a new Asus from Amazon that I threw into an external case, and an internal Pioneer from an old PC that I had in an old box. They are all fine hundreds of discs later. But I've noticed on discs that are damaged, the Sony can crank through while the other two can take 15-20 hours. I don't think it matters too much if it's working ok and you crank up all the settings in EAC. But I think older ones are made better than new ones if you can find a used one. And you can put one in enclosure yourself.




