Anydesk is so much more performant, how do they do it?

Anydesk is the absolute worst as a company but their product is so dang good. I've made the decision to switch myself and everyone I know to Rustdesk because of the harassment Anydesk has given me even for simply using it purely for helping friends and family for but the performance is so bad compared to Anydesk.

I'm running the self-hosted Rustdesk server physically located closely to all users (**under 50ms ping**) and a **10 gigabit** internet connection. All clients have at minimum **100mbps download and upload**. Rustdesk client is set to optimize reaction time but with all this even still when you get it side by side to Anydesk its noticeably slower regardless of which client I'm connecting to or which computer I'm connecting from.

How is Anydesk doing it? Do they have some kind of software tricks they're using to make it that much better?

Have you tried the Nightly <https://github.com/rustdesk/rustdesk/releases/tag/nightly> version of Rustdesk? I have been using the nightly for about 3 years or more and it has always been faster than the release version. They did some testing a while back to speed up the graphics with GPU optimizations. I think that got integrated into the main nightly a couple of months ago or so. I suspect that may help.

Under **Settings > Display** you can find many options. Like Optimize reaction time and different codecs. Usually the defaults work fine but I have talked to a few users who had to play with the settings to get the best speed. Good luck.

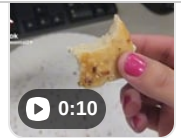

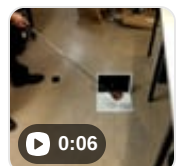

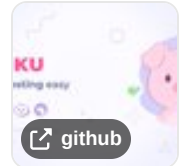
