

I wish that I could recommend RustDesk but I can't. At this point, rusktdesk doesn't work for me (on large scale), I cannot use it for my business. I had way too many problems with RustDesk IDs, it doesn't display client IDs correctly, some numbers are missing. I tried hosting my own rustdesk server but that didn't fix the problem. It worked fine on some PCs but on some it just didn't display ID correctly, only 8 numbers would show up. Maybe they fixed the problem by now (i had this problem a month ago) but give it a try and good luck.

VNC:

Wide support across all platforms but supports only video and no audio forwarding. Performance can be really awful and slow. I largely stay away from this protocol.

RDP:

Best performance and latency for Windows hosts IMO. Unfortunately, you can't have two people logged in at the same time (remote user and local user). RDP performance, in my opinion, is the base benchmark I use to compare other systems against for performance.

NoMachine:

Decent performance but suffers from glitches and random crashes. Also, I find that on Linux hosts, sometimes sound will stop working until the pulseaudio daemon is restarted. Kind of annoying.

TeamViewer:

I think it strikes a good balance between performance and features, Obviously constantly nags you unless you pay for it. Also can detect if you're using it for assisting family members or actual commercial use and you can get black-listed which will limit your sessions at only a few minutes.

RustDesk:

Open source alternative to TeamViewer and can be self-hosted. Pretty good performance and supports audio forwarding and can even shadow an existing RDP session (nifty feature). This is currently my preferred solution.

XPRA:

My second go-to. Handy for Linux hosts since it allows me to just use it seamlessly (per-window instead of a full desktop) and has great integration with SSH. It functions similarly to SSH -X, but with much better performance and also supports audio forwarding. Performance is decent, but audio can sometimes get desynced. Supports quite a few protocols (TCP, SSH, WebSocket, etc.).

Parsec:

Windows hosts only, though Linux clients are available. Performance is incredible. Good enough to even game through it. Discrete GPU is required though.
