For moving files towards your array, UNbalance is the plugin you want.

As soon as your drive is clear you go to Tools -> "New config", re-arrange your drives and get rid of your old one.

Note that this will also invalidate any parity drives that will need to be rebuilt.

You can also zero the drive first before removing it which will preserve parity but take forever and a day to complete.

Personally I decided to live dangerously and just rebuild parity because I'm not super patient.

Check the Shrink Array page. Short answer is you need to use something like unbalance or Krusader to copy all your data off the drive. Mover won't do this automatically, and you must do the copy disk to disk, doing disk to share will delete the data. Then you can either remove the disk, new config, rebuild parity, or zero the disk, new config, valid parity(with dual parity the remaining disks must stay in the same assigned slot).

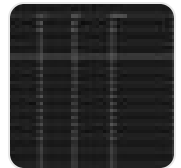

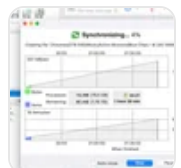
