

This question gets posted here extremely frequently. Sadly, there is no good answer.

You have 3 options which aren't perfect fits.

1. Indie games like overlord. There's a new one that pops up every couple months. They are usually clunky, short and somehow don't feel right. They get very close without just letting you have tons of minions do all the damage for you.
2. ARPGs. A good amount of minions but you still need to heavily invest in the build and the playstyle to end up with a build that feels less like a necromancer and more like a regular spellcaster with extra steps.
3. Fantasy themed strategy games. These usually include an undead/necromancer class or faction. Again, the undead horde is there but it controls the same way as any other class/faction in the game. The differences are purely aesthetic and numerical.

At least new games keep coming out so one day we'll get a perfect match. Potion games for example have like 4 total games and only 2 of them are decent-ish.


